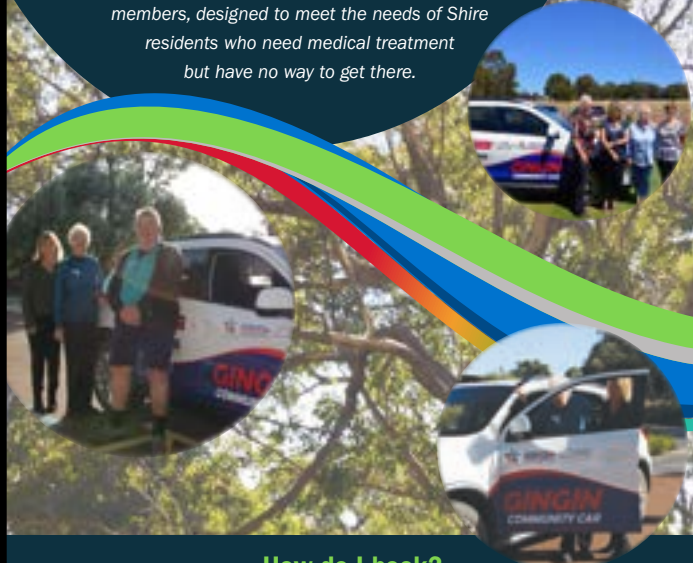

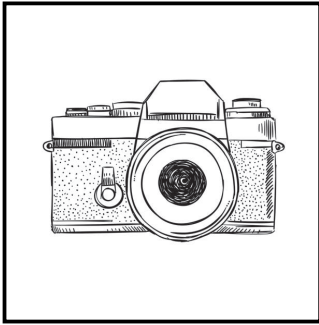

Amazon Frogbit Infestation update

Those of you who saw the December 2023 edition of this publication may remember the report of Amazon Frogbit having been detected in the Gingin Brook in the Neergabby area in November of that year. By May 2024 when initial chemical control was able to be undertaken the infestation was estimated to cover about 1.5km of the brook, indicating how fast this weed can spread.

The Shire of Gingin has responsibility for its ongoing control in the Gingin Brook and received a grant to undertake further control measures. The priority measure was to contain the infestation to the currently known area by the use of floating barrier booms. The booms were installed near Harriss Rd and Jones Rd in Neergabby in summer 2024/25. The barriers will need to be in place for several years and be monitored for build-up of weeds and debris and cleaned if necessary. Following the heavy rains we have experienced this winter it has been reported the barriers are no longer visible and it is feared they have been washed away.

Therefore, Amazon Frogbit plants are likely to have been transported further downstream. Landholders are requested to report any Amazon Frogbit plants seen, particularly any seen downstream of Jones St, Neergabby. This is particularly important to protect the lower reaches of the Gingin Brook and ultimately the Moore River and its estuary at Guilderton. Research by the Southeast Regional Centre for Urban Landcare (SERCUL) indicates the plants, although generally thought of as freshwater plants, are also able to live in brackish water so the estuary is at risk.

Landholders on the Brook, or with wetlands or dams on their properties that may have received water from flooding by Gingin Brook, also need to be vigilant as seed or pieces of plant may have been carried to these water bodies by flowing water. Also be aware waterbirds, animals or vehicles can transport the weed from one water body to another. As the weather warms the weed will grow

very quickly so action as soon as it is seen is needed. If the infestation consists of a very small number of plants immediate hand removal is an option. Completely drying the plants or otherwise effectively killing them before disposal is necessary. Follow up monitoring is required to ensure no viable pieces have been missed.

Amazon Frogbit is an aquatic plant with a native range in tropical areas of Central and South America but it has become naturalised on all continents except Antarctica. Previously known by the scientific name *Limnobium laevigatum*, it has now been reclassified resulting in the new name, *Hydrocharis laevigata*, now being the accepted scientific name in WA. It is an aggressively invasive plant in the same family as Water Hyacinth, *Eichhornia crassipes*. Both are declared plants in WA.

Amazon Frogbit has floating stems with round or kidney shape leaves up to 4cm across. Young leaves form a rosette which floats flat on the water surface. These leaves have a prominent spongy bulge on the underside of each leaf, resulting in the alternative name South American Spongeplant. Adult leaves, which may be held above the water, have leathery blades and the bulge is often less distinct. Roots are formed at the nodes of the stem and may float in the water or sometimes be rooted in the soil.

The flowers are about 15mm wide, white, pale yellow or light green, and usually unisexual. Male flowers often occur in clusters and have petals and sepals. Female flowers are solitary and have only rudimentary petals and sepals. The fruit is globular or ellipsoidal, fleshy and berry-like and up to 1.5cm long and 3.5mm wide. Each fruit contains up to 100 seeds. Pollination is usually by wind but other methods such as by insects have been observed. Once pollinated the female flower bends down into the water where the fruit develops and seed is then released into the water when mature. Spread is via seed or plant fragments. Any piece of plant which

contains a node can develop into a new plant. Fragments and seeds are carried by flowing water but also by animals and people including unintentionally on boats or recreational equipment.

The plant is sold as an easy-care, fast-growing pond or aquarium plant for nutrient removal and providing shelter, but its rapid growth quickly forms a dense mat which then becomes a problem. Use of this plant in outdoor water features in particular should be avoided. If you already have this plant and are disposing of excess or unwanted plants, please do so responsibly. Don't dispose of plants, fish or water from ponds or aquaria into a wetland, waterway, stormwater drain or bushland. If frogbit gets into the environment, it is a serious weed forming dense mats which displace native species and impact water quality and wildlife habitat. They also can clog waterways impacting recreational activities and clogging drains and irrigation pipes and damaging pumps.

If you find anything you think might be Amazon Frogbit please report to mypestguide.agric.wa.gov.au/reporter or on the MyPestGuide Reporter app. The app can be downloaded free from Apple or Google and allows reporting on your smartphone direct from the

field. If you are uncertain of the identification reporting via MyPestGuide will provide you with an identification. In the Shire of Gingin also report any sightings to the shire office mail@gingin.wa.gov.au.

For sightings in other local government areas, reporting to the local government responsible for the area would also be advisable. Local councils are often responsible for any public land, including waterways and drains, within their boundaries that are not otherwise vested

Sightings in Gingin can also be reported to us info@gingincatchment.org.au, but please report to the other agencies first, as they are the lead agencies for monitoring and control. Please let us know where else you have reported the sighting. If it hasn't been reported elsewhere accurate location details and a photo will be required if we need to report on your behalf.

Please note, the Waste Facility Passes will automatically reset every year, so you don't need to do anything. This year, your pass will reset on **1 September**.

Tip Pass FAQs:

- Lost your pass? You can order a replacement by contacting the Shire.
- If your property has been classified as 'Commercial', but you believe your property should receive a 'Residential' visit allowance, please contact the Shire.
- Keep your pass – it will automatically update on 1 September once Council has endorsed the new Fees and Charges.
- Any unused visits from the current year won't carry over to the next year once the new allocation starts.
- Keep your pass safe and use it responsibly.

Kanugi by Alan Gent

Although the relocation to Chignik Lake in Alaska was supposed to be one of those: “Let’s get rid of all the sentimental stuff” moves, Stella Cardel simply could not bring herself to part with Kanugi. It had been a marvellous holiday to Cairns on the Barrier Reef in Australia, and the souvenir coconut head was entirely appropriate. She wasn’t sure where the name ‘Kanugi’ came from, but when she looked at those impassive ‘eyes’ he seemed to approve. ‘Yes’, she thought, ‘he certainly seems to exude a strong personality’. 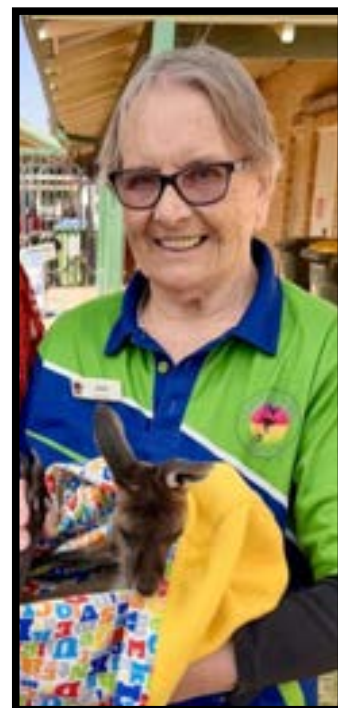
Jean lived in Gingin for approximately 9 years, having originally come from the United Kingdom.

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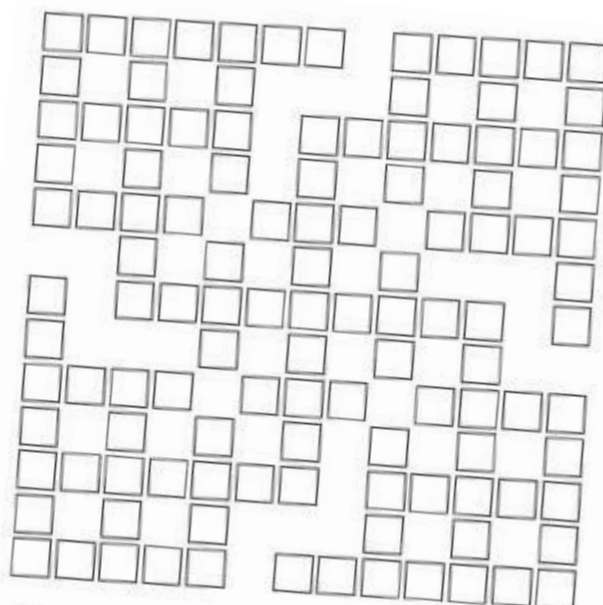
